BCSE Statement on COP 25 Outcomes

The outcomes of the 25th Conference of the Parties (COP 25) of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) were announced today.

BCSE President Lisa Jacobson offered the following statement:

"The failure of governments to reach agreement on key issues, including Article 6, at COP 25 makes the work of the private sector and sub-national actors even more essential.

"BCSE members are committed to action through a range of measures, including science-based targets, supply chain engagement to reduce emissions and investments in community resilience.

"Achieving the Paris Agreement commitments is a critical step to achieving the 2050 reductions that the scientific community says are needed to avoid the worst impacts of climate change. Working with international processes, including the UNFCCC, will be important to attaining the level of ambition required globally.

"BCSE members will continue to work throughout the world to provide clean energy technologies, resources and services to communities and will also continue to urge U.S. national, state and local governments to adopt policies that will put the U.S. on the trajectory to meet the climate challenge.

"While COP 25 did not achieve all of its goals, political will is building and we expect future meetings to yield the results the world is waiting for."
